
I wish all the teachers returning to school the best of luck for a stress-free school year. You are truly the foundation of our future generation and deserve our utmost respect.

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#### Candlewood Knolls Golf Cart Guidelines

- Golf Carts must have headlights and reflective tape affixed to the rear of the cart if they are going to be used after dark. (Reflective tail tape provided.)
- · Drivers must be 16 years of age to drive a Golf Cart or 15 years of age with a valid learners permit. You may also drive a Golf Cart if you are under the age of 16 if you are accompanied by an adult, 21 years of age or older, sitting alongside in the front seat.
- · Golf Cart capacity is limited to the available seating on each respective Golf Cart
- · Driving rules for Golf Carts are consistent with the general rules of the road. This in-cludes abiding by stop signs, yielding right of way, staying to the right side of the road, etc. It is the responsibility of the driver to know and follow the rules of the road.




The Hill (in theaters since August 11<sup>th</sup>)
