Candlewood Knolls Golf Cart Guidelines

- Golf Carts must have headlights and reflective tape affixed to the rear of the cart if they are going to be used after dark. (Reflective tail tape provided.)
- Drivers must be 16 years of age to drive a Golf Cart or 15 years of age with a valid learners permit. You may also drive a Golf Cart if you are under the age of 16 if you are accompanied by an adult, 21 years of age or older, sitting alongside in the front seat.
- Golf Cart capacity is limited to the available seating on each respective Golf Cart.
- Driving rules for Golf Carts are consistent with the general rules of the road. This includes abiding by stop signs, yielding right of way, staying to the right side of the road, etc. It is the responsibility of the driver to know and follow the rules of the road.



Debbie Minchin & Family - 19 Woods Road

Debbie was born and raised in Westchester and during and after her college years she spent her summers in Bridgehampton, Long Island. While she was working and living in Manhattan, she considered buying a summer home in the "Hamptons." Instead, a friend told her of options in Candlewood Isle on the infamous Candlewood Lake. While house hunting, she fell in love with the view at the waterfront home in the Knolls on Woods Road and purchased it in 1979 with a friend. A few years later her friend was bought out by Debbie's parents. For years she rented the house and eventually began enjoying summers in the Knolls while residing and working in New Rochelle, NY.





Debbie was a swimmer but learned to waterski on the lake. The "Holt Ski" club was formed and every morning she and her friend Rosie would ski along with former residents Bill Holt and Lorraine Petracca, both of whom enjoyed the sport in their 80's! She played tennis and bridge and enjoyed organizing various Woods Road and Knolls events. She is most proud of organizing the first playground renovation in the late 1980's.

While serving on the CK Board of Directors in the 90's, Debbie undertook the role of CK President in 1999–2000 and faced many challenges. New docks

were needed, and the clubhouse required many repairs to prevent being condemned. With the goal of reminding homeowners of the beauty of the lake, she directed the beautification of our beaches with Adirondack chairs, benches, and new sand.

Debbie retired from a 30-year teaching career in 2020. With a bachelor's degree in History & Education from Vassar College, and MBA from Columbia University, Debbie taught high school social studies and economics courses at New Rochelle High School, as well as ran their internship program. While spending her summers in the Knolls, Debbie tutored many Knolls' children (my son included). She is currently a p/t professor at Manhattanville College and is the Co-Director of Student Programs at the Holocaust & Human Rights Educational Center in Westchester.

As of January 2022, Debbie has joined many others that have made the transition from seasonal to all year-round Knolls' resident. Her children are frequent visitors: Dave (PhD, Sr Lecturer/International Studies at Yale University and consultant in a "think tank" at Harvard) and wife, Lauren (a pediatrician), live in Weston, CT; Felicia, an artist, lives in Massachusetts, and Michael (Project Manager — Landscape Architecture & Design) lives in Manhattan.

Debbie's favorite thing about the Knolls is the sense of community. The slower pace, as well as displays of kindness and genuine acts of helping neighbors are all what enhance the views from her home. As with teaching, she has enjoyed the generational transitions in the Knolls; seeing kids you remember as toddlers growing into incredible adults, some who have their own children now! The Knolls community was founded in 1929, and for Debbie Minchin the Knolls has represented fun and friendship since 1979.





Around the Town...

THE TOWN OF NEW FAIRFIELD

If you are a seasonal resident of the Knolls, you may not be aware of all the happenings in our quaint little town. New Fairfield's Population: 13,579 (2020 census)



The Senior Center located in the center of town has a wide variety of activities including Mahhong, Zumba, Quilting, Tai Chi, an Investment Club, and Technology Assistance. The Public Library has a summer reading program, book discussions, craft demonstrations, and an annual book sale. Our Fire House – located on Ball Pond Road – is where you can catch the commuter Hart shuttle to Metro North's Southeast Train Station. The NF Lion's Club hosts tons of events – parades, carnivals, pancake breakfasts, etc. NF's Parks & Rec hosts specialty camps, the annual Sip & Stroll held in May, summer concerts and family movie nights at Memorial Field, as well as the Annual Run

for the Turkeys 5K in November and the tree lighting on Thanksgiving weekend. FYI - The Illuminated Boat Parade on the lake will be held on July 15th.

NF is home to 3 Italian Restaurants (Portofinos, Biscotti's & Bruno's) as well as 3 hair salons, 3 nail salons, 3 liquor stores, 2 auto repair shops, a bakery, a hardware store, Prime Time Fitness, and a Community Thrift Shop. Johnny's Market is the town's butcher shop, and offers deli selections, catering, and groceries. Our dog park, located at the high school, is very popular among our residents and we have an animal welfare center too.

Book of the Week... The Christie Affair by Nina deGramont

A famous author disappears for eleven days...

A woman infiltrated the life of author Agatha Christie and her husband. She became part of their lives and then stole away the husband. But why? What was her plot? It began decades before, in Ireland, when she was a young girl. She and another man, whom she loved deeply, were destined to be together until War and shameful secrets tore them apart. Then acts of unspeakable cruelty kept them separated. There are many plots to this story as the mistress, the author, the boyfriend, and the husband all have their own paths that eventually intertwine.



What will someone do in the name of love? What kind of crime can someone never forgive? This novel explores these questions and more. I enjoyed this book because it was an interesting fictional twist about the famous author Agatha Christie's disappearance. The author creates her own story of the mistress of Agatha's husband, and the story is predominately written from the viewpoint of the mistress.




