Candlewood Knolls Golf Cart Guidelines

- Golf Carts must have headlights and reflective tape affixed to the rear of the cart if they are going to be used after dark. (Reflective tail tape provided.)
- Drivers must be 16 years of age to drive a Golf Cart or 15 years of age with a valid learners permit. You may also drive a Golf Cart if you are under the age of 16 if you are accompanied by an adult, 21 years of age or older, sitting alongside in the front seat.
- Golf Cart capacity is limited to the available seating on each respective Golf Cart.
- Driving rules for Golf Carts are consistent with the general rules of the road. This includes abiding by stop signs, yielding right of way, staying to the right side of the road, etc. It is the responsibility of the driver to know and follow the rules of the road.

# Las Mananitas – Brewster, NY

If you are in the mood for sipping margaritas and pairing your drinks with authentic Mexican food, then check out Las Mananitas in nearby Brewster, NY. The décor is rustic and welcoming with its large stone fireplace and wooden

beams. You can choose indoor dining, sun or shade, a secluded patio, sidewalk seating, or a rooftop deck while enjoying the views of the East Branch Reservoir and tree-filled hillsides. The setting creates the perfect ambiance to your meal.

The food is plentiful and includes traditional Mexican entrees as well as vegetarian, beef, chicken, fish, and pork options. The guacamole is made fresh tableside and there is occasional live mariachi music. The food is reasonably priced with entrees ranging from \$16.95 to \$25.95 and the service is fast and friendly.

Las Mananitas is located at 1250 Route 22 in Brewster, just north of 684 and is open 7 days a week all year round. They do not take reservations (except for large private parties) and you will likely have to wait for a table, especially on the weekends.



# Book of the Week ... The Silent Patient by Alex Michaelides



**The Silent Patient** is a thrilling story with a mix of suspense, plotting, and tragedy. It is a story of a woman's act of violence against her husband and the therapist obsessed with uncovering her motive. Alicia's life is seemingly perfect. She is a famous painter married to a fashion photographer and lives in a grand house in one of London's most desirable areas. One evening her husband returns home late from a fashion shoot, and Alicia shoots him five times, and then never speaks another word. Her refusal to talk, or to give any kind of explanation, turns a domestic tragedy into something far more mysterious. The

murder captures the public's imagination and casts Alicia into notoriety. Theo Faber is a criminal psychotherapist who has waited a long time for the opportunity to work with Alicia. His determination to get her to talk and unravel the mystery of why she shot her husband takes him down a twisting path into his own motivations. I enjoyed this story because it was about romance, suspense, and crime and it was so captivating with a twisted plot and ending that the reader never expects.


