> Candlewood Knolls Golf Cart Guidelines

- Golf Carts must have headlights and reflective tape affixed to the rear of the cart if they are going to be used after dark. (Reflective tail tape provided.)
- Drivers must be 16 years of age to drive a Golf Cart or 15 years of age with a valid learners permit. You may also drive a Golf Cart if you are under the age of 16 if you are accompanied by an adult, 21 years of age or older, sitting alongside in the front seat.
- Golf Cart capacity is limited to the available seating on each respective Golf Cart.
- Driving rules for Golf Carts are consistent with the general rules of the road. This includes abiding by stop signs, yielding right of way, staying to the right side of the road, etc. It is the responsibility of the driver to know and follow the rules of the road.



Around the Town...



Brookfield

The Town of Brookfield is one of the five towns surrounding the lake and home of the only two waterfront dining facilities – The Candlewood Inn and Down the Hatch.

In "olden" days, the Candlewood Inn was a restaurant located at 506 Candlewood Lake Road and was accessible by boat. After undergoing a million-dollar update and expansion, it became a catering facility exclusively for private events in 1999. When hosting weddings and private events, their guests are treated to a visually spectacular setting, top notch food, and excellent service.



Down the Hatch is a seasonal restaurant, and only waterfront restaurant, on the lake. Chances are that whenever you venture to enjoy their bar and/or food, you will certainly run into several Knolls neighbors! Located at 292 Candlewood Lake Road, or by boat (hang a left out of our cove then head straight) - the Hatch has a casual, fun, friendly atmosphere. It is currently opened

Tuesday through Sunday – 11:30am to midnight; the kitchen closes at 9pm on Tuesday through Saturday and at 7pm on Sunday. It is a nice place to take the family if you don't feel like cooking!



Brookfield also has a variety of parks and hiking trails including the Still River Greenway Trail, Old Bridge Sanctuary, Williams Park, and Birch Rocks Sanctuary. A local favorite is the Happy Landings Open Space Loop located at 55 Whisconier Rd which consists of 55 acres

of open fields and approximately 19 acres of woodlands. It is a 3.5km loop trail that takes an average of 46 minutes to complete and is great for hiking and walking. Dogs are welcome but must be on a leash.

Finally, you may want to experience a garden center like no other. Brookfield is the home of Shakespeare's Garden, which started out in 1988 as a landscaping company specializing in fine gardening. In 2007, they expanded their offerings with perennials, tress, and shrubs and a barn shop which is filled with treasures to enhance your gardens and home. At Christmas, the shop is magical! Shakespeare's Garden is




located at 25 Obtuse Road South and opened March thru December Mon–Sat 8am-5pm and Sun 9am-5pm. In January/February they are open Thursday through Sunday.

Book of the Week...Small Fry by Lisa Brennan-Jobs




Small Fry is Lisa Brennan-Jobs's story of a childhood spent between two imperfects, but extraordinary homes. Lisa was born on a farm and named in a field by her parents--artist Chrisann Brennan and Steve Jobs. Lisa's father was a rising star in Silicon Valley who was rarely present in her life but took an interest in her as she grew older. He was a complicated man who was known to be cold, critical and unpredictable. Scrappy, wise, and funny, the author provides an unforgettable guide through her parents' fascinating and disparate worlds. This book is a portrait of a complex family and an insight into Steve Jobs' rise to fame as told by his daughter. Lisa writes very well, descriptively, and engagingly but also appears to be begging for pity. She explained this in her guote, *"I see now that we were at cross-purposes. For him, I was*

a blot on a spectacular ascent, as our story did not fit with the narrative of greatness and virtue, he might have wanted for himself. My existence ruined his streak. For me, it was the opposite: the closer I was to him, the less I would feel ashamed; he was part of the world, and he would accelerate me into the light." I enjoy memoirs that provide insights into famous people's backgrounds and how they evolve. This was a good read. Happy Reading...Maureen Clegg
