For those of you who have a vegetable garden like me, you may be wondering what to do with all that zucchini it keeps producing! I've made pancakes, bread, muffins, pizza, pasta, etc. and thought I'd share one of my favorite recipes made with zucchini:

#### Zucchini Quiche

3 c. shredded zucchini

1 chopped onion

1 ½ c. Bisquick

4 eggs

1/4 c. grated parmesan cheese

1/3 c. vegetable oil

1 c. shredded mozzarella

1 c. sweet italian sausage, cooked & crumbled

Grease & flour a 9x12 pan - Mix all the ingredients together – Pour in pan Bake in 350° preheated oven for 45 min. to 1 hr (Top should be light golden brown)

#### Candlewood Knolls Golf Cart Guidelines

- Golf Carts must have headlights and reflective tape affixed to the rear of the cart if they are going to be used after dark. (Reflective tail tape provided.)
- Drivers must be 16 years of age to drive a Golf Cart or 15 years of age with a valid learners permit. You may also drive a Golf Cart if you are under the age of 16 if you are accompanied by an adult, 21 years of age or older, sitting alongside in the front seat.
- Golf Cart capacity is limited to the available seating on each respective Golf Cart.
- Driving rules for Golf Carts are consistent with the general rules of the road. This includes abiding by stop signs, yielding right of way, staying to the right side of the road, etc. It is the responsibility of the driver to know and follow the rules of the road.

#### The Sandvik Family - 10 Meadoway

Nancy Regula and Dave Sandvik were raised in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn, NY but did not meet until 1990 at a bar in Bay Ridge. At the time, Dave was a carpenter and Nancy a nurse at Methodist Hospital in Park Slope, Brooklyn where she is still employed. They married in 1993 and lived in Bay Ridge for 5 years. Dave became a NYC Firefighter in 1997 and they moved to Staten Island a year later where Nancy had family residing nearby.

Growing up, Dave was familiar with Candlewood Lake and the Knolls. His maternal grandparents had a "country house" on Rocky Hill Road in New Fairfield and his parents later bought their summer home on Margerie Drive in NF. He spent weekends and summers at the NF Town Park, and that is where he learned how to swim. His brother, Johnny, who is a



carpenter, knew CK summer residents Mike Dapolite and Lucas Scheer and had worked on several construction projects on homes in the Knolls. Dave introduced Nancy to "lake life" and after spending a day at North Beach as a guest of the Dapolite's in 2007, they began looking for a house to buy in the Knolls. After a yearlong search, they bought their summer home at 10 Meadoway in April 2008.

Nancy and Dave were drawn to the family environment and friendliness of the Knolls. And then, of course, there was the children's program which has been enjoyed by their 3 sons. David, 23, was the first recipient of the Herb Mulholland Award and later became a counselor. A graduate from Maritime College, he currently resides in Florida and is employed by Moran Tugboats. Nicholas, age 19, has worked in construction with his uncle and is currently considering his future career options. Luke, age 14, will be attending high school this September and has been fortunate enough to spend every summer of his life in the Knolls. The newest member of the family is Elsie, their 6-month-old rescue dog.

The Sandvik family also enjoy off season visits to the lake and have attended many Halloween parties and other Knolls events. They came to the lake with just a kayak and learned how to water ski on friends' boats. Eight years later they purchased a boat and now enjoy cruising the



Dave's career as a firefighter spanned through the 9/11 tragedy, Hurricane Sandy and the COVID pandemic, and despite many retirements amongst his peers, he only recently – as of May 2022 – retired after 25 ½ years. #### Around the Town...





The Hopkins Vineyard is a scenic 25 mile/45-minute drive from CK – north of New Milford in Litchfield County. Located at 25 Hopkins Road in New Preston, CT, (GPS: Warren, CT) it overlooks Lake Waramaug. The vineyard has a tasting area and gift shop and has Connecticut's first winery-established wine bar. They have live music on most weekends, and they also host special events such as weddings and bridal showers on the premises.

The property has been owned by the Hopkins family for over 225 years; the first Hopkins came to New England on the Mayflower. Judith & Bill Hopkins transformed their dairy farm into a vineyard in 1979 and produce eleven varieties of grapes. The winery is known for its family hospitality.

During May through October, they are open

Across the way from the vineyards, overlooking Lake Waramaug, is an elegant family-run inn and seasonal restaurant. The Hopkins Inn & Restaurant is located at 22 Hopkins Road, Warren, CT and features eleven guest rooms and 2 apartments all year round decorated with antique furnishings. The restaurant is renowned for its



contemporary Austrian cuisine and has indoor and outdoor dining. When the restaurant is closed for the season, the inn operates as a bed & breakfast. Franz and Beth Schober have owned and operated the inn for over forty years.





#### **BOOK REVIEW** – Educated by Tara Westover



Tara Westover's family was isolated from mainstream society. She was born to survivalists in the mountains of Idaho. Her mother was a midwife and healer, and her father owned a junkyard. Her father isolated the family from what he believed was government control and prepared the family for the end of the world. There was no one to ensure the children received an education and no one to intervene when one of Tara's older brothers became violent. Her father even forbade hospitals and the family never sought professional medical treatment; all maladies were treated at home with herbs.

Tara Westover was 17 the first time she set foot in a classroom. Lacking any formal education, Tara began to educate herself and taught herself enough mathematics

and grammar to be admitted to Brigham Young University, where she studied history. She learned about important world events like the Holocaust and the civil rights movement and her quest for knowledge transformed her. She eventually ended up at Harvard and Cambridge.

Educated is an account of the struggle for self-invention. The more educated Tara became, the further from her family she found herself. It is a story of fierce family loyalty and of the grief that comes with severing the closest of ties. I enjoyed this memoir because the author was so wide eyed with wonder about the world, and it just kept leading her to greater things. She did not set out to distinguish herself from her family, yet in the end her journey had her wondering if there would ever be a way home.
